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PASTELS

If you have pastels and are happy with them, you're all set. If you need additional hues/values/densities, it's best to buy online. **They aren't available locally**. Don't buy cheap pastels; they will not have enough pigment to perform well.

PAPER

I recommend using a sanded pastel paper, such as **UArt** or **Pastel Premier**. You can see other options at Dakota Pastels' website.

EASEL - optional

If you have a portable easel that you like to use, bring it. The art center has easels that will work, but they don't have a forward tilt.

EASEL BOARD

You will need a board, such as gator foam, MDF or wood, to tape your pastel paper to. It should be a little bigger than your pastel paper size. For example, if you have 9 x 12 paper, a good easel board size is 15 x 18. Some examples:

11" X 17" wooden board - amazon

16 x 20 gator board - amazon

OTHER SUPPLIES

- Reference photos: 5" x 7" or larger photos of your chosen subjects, preferably taken by you or with photographer's permission. Please do not bring very small photos, or magazine images.
- Pencil 2B or harder
- Artist's tape, 3/4" or 1" this is a special white tape, NOT drafting or masking tape. Here's an example:

artist's tape

- Glassine, or wax or tracing paper for protecting your paintings in transport same size as pastel paper
- Brushes one or two 1"- 2" bristle or nylon (not watercolor brushes) for underpainting and/or brushing off pastel nothing expensive as the sanded paper wears them down.
- Kneadable erasers
- Apron or clothes you don't care about

OPTIONAL

- · Watercolors or acrylics for underpainting
- If you like to paint still life and floral subjects, you can bring them instead of photos.
